


## Property Map

- The trails are open from dawn to dusk.
- There is no fee to use the trails.
- Trail markers are indicated by color listed on the map. For example, the Brewster Lake Trail has red markers.
- Pierce Cedar Creek Institute grounds and buildings are alcohol and smoke-free.
- Dogs must remain leashed at all times.
- Please clean up after pets.
- A pet waste station is located at the head of the Tall Grass Prairie Trail.
- Motorized vehicles, bicycles, snowmobiles, watercraft and horses are prohibited.
- Fishing, hunting, camping, trapping and plant collecting are prohibited.
- Restroom facilities are available in the Visitor Center after-hours. Please enter from the west side. Hours may vary by season.

**LUPINE TRAIL** [.4 MILES]  
The primary features of this trail are retention ponds, panoramic views, a small section of open forest, and a skunk cabbage dominated wetland.

**BLACK WALNUT TRAIL** [.2 MILES]  
It provides wonderful views of the Visitor Center and Short grass prairie through a black cherry grove.

**BEECH MAPLE RIDGE TRAIL** [2.1 MILES]  
The path passes through a second growth forest, mature oak and beech-maple forest, and a fen. Hikers can enjoy views of the wetland from the observation deck and return to the Visitor Center by taking the boardwalk to the Lupine Trail.

**BREWSTER LAKE TRAIL** [1.8 MILES]  
This trail crosses and passes by a number of beautiful habitats, including a fen, a mature oak forest with unusually large trees, and a pasture frequented by deer and turkey. A trail extension provides a scenic view of Brewster Lake.

**TALL GRASS PRAIRIE TRAIL** [.4 MILES]  
This is a shortcut of the Beech Maple Ridge Trail. View the beauty of our constructed wildflower prairies as you walk the rolling hills.

**OLD FARM TRAIL** [1.3 MILES]  
This is one of our easiest trails to hike. It provides open and forested views. The prairie loop provides a closer view of the prairie.

**WHITE TAIL TRAIL** [.4 MILES]  
This primitive trail meanders along a deer path, providing access to beech forests with a thick Pennsylvania sedge carpet. It provides a great view of the cedar swamps and the lush skunk cabbage that define this lowland area. This dynamic trail may offer more of a challenge than other trails.

**CEDAR CREEK TRAIL** [.9 MILES]  
The trail runs through a sand prairie with a great view of Cedar Creek and loops back to the Beech Maple Ridge Trail. This primitive trail is somewhat more strenuous than other trails.

The trails are marked by metal plaques with arrows indicating the trail's course. Arrows are color coded to match the trail's color on the map.
